Ms. Woolfolk Inspires Curiosity & Creativity Among Our Youngest Girls

In the early learning, kindergarten, and 1st-grade group, Ms. Woolfolk is greeted each day with bright smiles and a cheerful morning song. She facilitates a discussion about the word of the week—RESPECT—exploring its meaning and usage.

With enthusiasm, the girls sing the Girls Inc. "Strong, Smart & Bold" song, setting a positive tone and reminding them of their potential. Each girl shares something she enjoyed about the previous day, practicing their speaking skills and celebrating small joys.

Storytime is a highlight, featuring captivating tales about friendships and being bucket fillers. The girls learn about the parts of a book and the importance of respecting books. They rate the story and draw their favorite parts, expressing creativity and reflecting on their learning.

Engaging lessons in math, ELA, science, or Girls Inc. programming ensures interactive learning. Early finishers choose from activities like puzzles, reading, or quiet play.

Recess offers a chance to run, jump, and play, soaking up fresh air and sunshine while developing physical skills. The afternoon concludes with Art Club, where the girls work on creative projects, filling the classroom with their wonderful artwork.

We are grateful for Ms. Woolfolk's passion and enthusiasm which keeps our young girls engaged and excited to return each day.
